Tulare Kings College and Career Collaborative receives \$\textit{\Omega}\)illion grant to serve underrepresented students

The Tulare Kings College and Career
Collaborative (TKCCC) was recently awarded a
\$2 million grant through the second round of
funding by the K12 Strong Workforce
Program— an ongoing program of the California
Community Colleges designed to support
schools with students transitioning from
secondary to postsecondary education. Last fall, TKCCC conducted a needs assessment and
discovered that socioeconomically disadvantaged students, English learners, special education
students, and foster youth are disproportionately underrepresented as Career Technical Education
(CTE) Pathway completers in the twounty region.

Together, TKCCC and 10 partner districts applied for K12 Strong Workforce funding to support the student groups identified in the needs assessment to complete their career pathways and develop personalized, viable postsecondary plans. The partner districts include Burton School District, Corcoran Unified School District, Cutl@rosi Joint Unified School District, Dinuba Unified School District, Exeter Unified School District, Farmersville Unified School District, Hanford Joint Union High School District, Lindsay Unified School District, and Tulare Joint Union High School District.
