



Completing the Census helps ensure Tulare County receives its share of federal funds

April 1, 2020 is Census Day. The decennial event is conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau to count the number of people—adults and children—living in the United States. Data from the Census is used by lawmakers to determine the number of seats in the House of Representatives and to apportion billions of dollars in federal support to states, counties, and communities. “I urge everyone to take a moment to complete the Census questionnaire online utilizing the code you received on a postcard from the Census Bureau,” said Tulare County Superintendent of Schools Tim Hire. “Making sure everyone at your address is counted helps Tulare County receive its share of federal funds to support communities and schools.”
