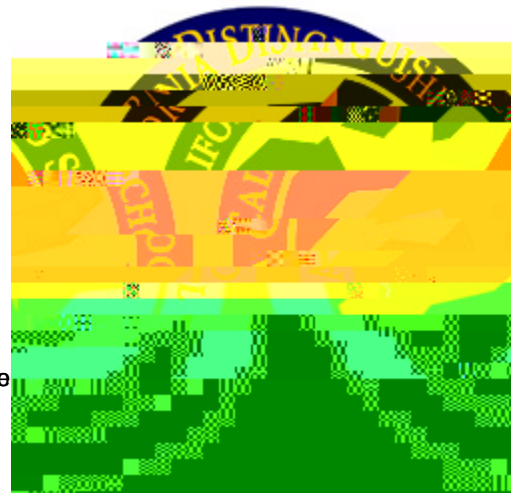

UPHS named California Distinguished School
